
#### **Core Values:**







#### Witness

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$22,700

30.24% of Ministries Budget & 3.88% of total FY26 Budget

Current FY25 Budget - \$20,700

#### **Thriving Congregations**

#### Worship

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$11,050 14.72% of Ministries Budget & 1.89% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget – \$7,900

The mission of the Faith Formation Committee is to nurture

Christian education and foster spiritual growth for all ages through the study of God's Word. We are committed to creating spaces where children, youth, young adults, and families can grow in faith, deepen their

relationship with Christ, and build meaningful connections within the church community.

Our ministry currently provides a wide range of opportunities, including Sunday School classes, Vacation Bible School, Children's Ministry, Youth Group, Young Adults Ministry, and Family Outreach. Each of these programs is designed not only to teach but also to form disciples who live out their faith in everyday life.

As our congregation continues to grow, so too, do the needs of the children, youth, and families we serve. #### **BELONGING**

#### **Finance & Office Administration**

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$20,271 27.00% of Ministries Budget & 3.46% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$20,271

The Finance Team plays an essential role in ensuring that our church's resources are used faithfully and wisely to support our mission and ministries. As stewards of our operating budget, they work to align our financial practices with our values—helping us give generously, plan responsibly, and sustain the life of our

church for years to come. Through the annual stewardship campaign, the team invites all members to participate in the spiritual practice of giving, recognizing that every gift—large or small—helps make ministry possible.

Meeting regularly to review income,

expenses, and long-term goals, the Finance Team also manages key operational costs such as office supplies, technology, payroll, and communication tools that keep our ministries running smoothly. They oversee the endowment fund, ensuring that gifts invested today will continue to bless the church in the future. We are deeply grateful for the care, integrity, and dedication this team brings to its work.

#### Welcoming

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$2,000 2.66% of Ministries Budget & 0.34% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$2,000

Stewardship is about faithfully using the gifts God has entrusted to us to build up the body of Christ and extend hospitality to others. The Welcome Team embodies this spirit of stewardship by creating an

environment where every person who enters our doors feels loved, valued, and welcomed. Through warm greetings, thoughtful connection, and intentional follow-up, this ministry helps new visitors experience the grace and belonging that define our church family.

By investing time, energy, and resources into welcoming others, the team helps cultivate a culture of generosity and care that reflects God's own welcome to us. In this way, the ministry of welcome is not just an act of hospitality—it is an act of discipleship, nurturing community and strengthening the church as a place where God's love is lived out in tangible ways. The Welcome Team provides goodie bags to our visitors, new member lunches, new member swag, and host families to foster

new relationships!

#### **Session & Leadership Expenses**

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$1,000

1.33% of Ministries Budget & 0.17% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$600

Through Session development we grow as disciples of Jesus Christ and our calling to be ordained and installed officers of the Presbyterian Church. Experiences include: officer training, Session education material, and the officer retreat. This allows for us to develop servant leaders for our congregation and equip all for service.

#### CONNECTING

#### **Pastoral Care**

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$800 1.07% of Ministries Budget & 0.14% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$800

Pastoral care is one of the most meaningful ways we live out

our calling to love and support one another as followers of Christ. Through pastoral care, we share God's love in real and practical ways: by providing meals for families in transition, offering grief booklets to



those who are mourning, celebrating new babies, and checking in on our older adults and college students. Whether it's a workshop on emotional or financial health, Men's Prayer Breakfast, or a simple visit with someone who's lonely, each act of care reminds our congregation that we are deeply connected as one family in faith. Our Pastoral Care budget supports teachers in our congregation, our home bound members, hospitality for funerals, and college student connections. This ministry shows that stewardship is about living generously. When we care for one another through life's ups and downs, we become the hands and feet of Christ in our community. Investing in

pastoral care helps our church stay grounded in compassion and reminds us that God's love is best shared through simple acts of kindness, presence, and support.

#### Faith & Fellowship

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$2,500 3.33% of Ministries Budget & 0.43% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$1,000

The focus of the Faith & Fellowship Team is to offer multiple ways for church participants to socially engage with one another

outside of Sunday worship. The budget includes: Campfire Church, Rally Day,

Lemonade of the Lawn, Prayer
Breakfasts, Coffee Club, and funeral
meal expenses.

It has been a joy to regularly hold Soul Feast, our monthly church dinner! Through our budget we can provide first time coupons for our visitors and neighbors. The budget assists in the food

cost and the other expenses involved in church family dinner.

Faith and Fellowship is the hub of breaking bread as a community. Through this ministry team we celebrate well!

#### **Personnel**

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$371,667 63.53% of total FY26 Budget FY24 Budget - \$347,998

The Personnel Team plays a vital role in supporting the people who make our ministry possible. Their work ensures that our church staff, from pastors to nursery caregivers are cared for,

equipped, and encouraged in their call to serve.

The personnel budget supports fair compensation, benefits, and continuing education—investments that help our leaders grow and bring fresh ideas and energy back to our congregation. It also allows us to welcome seminary interns from Columbia Theological Seminary, helping to shape future church leaders, and to offset some expenses for our preschool, supporting one of our most important ministries to young families. In addition, the personnel budget provides all childcare for church events, ensuring

that everyone can fully participate in church life. We are deeply grateful for the creativity, dedication, and joy our staff brings to the life of First Presbyterian Church, helping our community thrive in faith and service.

#### **Facilities & Grounds**

Proposed 2026 Budget - \$138,300 23.64% of total FY26 Budget Current FY25 Budget - \$126,388

Our Facilities and Grounds Team plays a key role in helping our church live out its mission by caring for the spaces where ministry happens every day. Their work is an act of stewardship—tending to

our buildings, grounds, and technology so

that all who enter our campus experience a welcoming, safe, and functional environment. From maintaining the church building to managing utilities and caring for our custodians, this team ensures that our facilities support every aspect of church life. They've also partnered closely with our preschool, helping create spaces where children can learn and grow, including new updates coming this year like a playground shade and plans for an outdoor chapel/ classroom/theater in our park on Brown Street that will serve both our congregation and the community. Your pledge goes to helping keep the lights on!!

We give thanks for this team's ongoing efforts to make our campus more accessible and sustainable, including the work toward installing a new HVAC system and ensuring our restrooms are handicap accessible. Every project—large or small—reflects our commitment to using what God has entrusted to us in ways that foster connection, creativity, and care for all.

#### First Presbyterian Community Preschool

It is with great joy and gratitude that we celebrate the opening of our First Presbyterian Community Preschool this fall. This new ministry has already brought new life and energy into our church as children and families fill our classrooms, playground, and worship spaces with laughter and curiosity. The preschool operates with its own independent budget, overseen by the

Preschool Board, while our Finance Team provides guidance and support to ensure healthy collaboration and transparency.

We share resources, host joint events, and partner closely in ways that strengthen both the preschool and our congregation. Our church supports the

preschool by covering facility overhead and utilities, investing in this vital work of education, care, and faith formation.
